Mary L. Irvine Executive Director mirvine@ncbar.gov Revenue received by NC IOLTA in the third quarter remained well below 2019 figures. Interest income earned on IOLTA accounts between January and August of 2020 totaled \$2.78 million, a 17% decrease compared to the same period in 2019. As interest earned on IOLTA accounts is received in the month after it is earned, IOLTA is currently receiving September participant interest income. IOLTA staff and Board will continue to closely monitor income and interest rates over the coming months and communicate impacts to stakeholders.

IOLTA seeks to maintain positive policies at Prime Partners and other banks paying interest rates higher than the average on IOLTA accounts. Prime Partners are banks that agree to go above and beyond the IOLTA eligibility requirements to improve access to justice. Prime Partners pay at least 75% of the Federal Funds target rate or .75%, whichever is higher. The following banks maintain Prime Partner status:

- Bank of Oak Ridge
- Carolina State Bank
- Premier Federal Credit Union
- Providence Bank & Trust
- Settlement agent accounts only: Congressional Bank

Benchmark Banks pay at least 65% of the Federal Funds target rate or .65%, whichever is higher. The following banks maintain Benchmark Bank status:

- American Bank of the Carolinas Bank of America • Aquesta Bank
- PNC Bank
- Pinnacle Bank

• Settlement agent accounts only: Bank United, First Federal Bank of Florida, and Sandy Spring Bank

State Funds

NC IOLTA administers state funding on behalf of the NC State Bar under the Domestic Violence Victim Assistance Act. Funds generated by costs assessed in civil and criminal court actions are distributed to Legal Aid of North Carolina and Pisgah Legal Services to support legal assistance for domestic violence victims. During the 2019-2020 year, NC IOLTA administered \$903,002 in domestic violence state funds.

Grants

Applications for 2021 funding from NC IOLTA were due on October 1. NC IOLTA staff and trustees review applications and finalize awards at the December 1, 2020 Grantmaking meeting. More information about IOLTA's grantmaking purposes can be found at www.nciolta.org.

HISTORY OF STATE FUNDS DISBURSEMENT BY IOLTA

Access to Civil Justice (ATCJ)

In 1988, The General Assembly provided dedicated state funding from court filing fees for providing access to legal representation for indigent persons in certain civil matters throughout the state through now three legal aid organizations (Legal Aid of NC, Pisgah Legal Services, and Charlotte Center for Legal Advocacy). Additional appropriation of recurring funds was included in the state budget for these purposes beginning in 2006-07; however, the appropriation was removed from the 2014-15 budget. Allocations were based on poverty population in areas served as established by the census.

In the 2017 legislative session, the ATCJ Act was repealed and funding was eliminated.

Domestic Violence Victim Assistance (DV)

As of October 2004, the General Assembly began providing funds for now two legal aid programs (Legal Aid of NC and Pisgah Legal Services) specifically for domestic violence work. Allocations are: 20% divided equally among all NC counties and 80% allocated according to the numbers of 50b protective orders filed in their program areas during the previous state fiscal year as established by AOC statistics.

Foreclosure Protection

In 2008, the General Assembly appropriated additional funds for foreclosure protection legal services to be divided evenly between the Land Loss Prevention Project and the Financial Protection Law Center. Beginning with the 2009-10 state year, funding was for Financial Protection Law Center only. Funding was eliminated in state year 2014-15.

Veteran's Assistance

In 2016, the General Assembly appropriated one-time non-recurring funding of \$100,000 to Pisgah Legal Services for 2016-2017. Funding was received again in 2017-18 & 2018-19. The funds were used for civil legal representation of veterans.

Center for Death Penalty Litigation (CDPL)

The Center for Death Penalty Litigation receives funds for the purpose of providing training, consultation, brief banking, and other assistance to attorneys representing indigent capital defendants. IDS began administering this funding with the 2009-10 year and currently contracts with CDPL for these services.
